1. Visual or Spatial
Written, pictures, diagrams, visuals. Fast Talkers; Impatient; Artistic; Daydream when nothing to look at.
2. Logical or Mathematical
Routines; Consistency. Think conceptually, patterns. Prefers an end goal; Mental math; Less creative.
3. Linguistic or Read/Write
Written words; note-taking. Text is powerful. Enjoy reading/writing. Allow time to absorb.
4. Intrapersonal or Solitary
Solo; self-managed; goal setters. Introverts. Prefer unsupervised; space; independence. Self-aware.
5. Aural or Musical
Verbalizes; Memory for dates/trivia/names; Linear; Slower Talker; Works well to music; Word problems.
6. Kinesthetic or Physical
Active; Touching/Feeling. Use body language/gestures/movement; prefer manipulatives. Enjoy sports.
7. Interpersonal or Social
Collaboration; teams. Storytellers. Natural Leaders. Relate to others. Creative in Groups.
8. Naturalist or Outdoor
Observers; Hands-on; Experimental. Interest-based; Scientific. Prefer outdoor environments, manipulatives.
